

BEURSSCHOUWBURG (1)

Auguste Ortsstraat 20/28, 1000 Bruxelles

ARRIVING BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Métro 1 + 5 (Stop at De Brouckère, 700 m walk on flat terrain, or stop at Sainte Catherine – 400m walk on flat terrain)

Tram 3 + 4 + 32 (stop at Bourse - 95 m walk, mostly flat-)

Bus 29 + 66 + 71 (Stop at De Brouckère – 700 m walk on flat terrain –) and 86 + 95 (stop at Grand Place – 400m walk, uphill at the beginning)

ENTERING THE BUILDING

The welcome desk at Beursschouwburg is located on the ground floor. The entrance is at floor-level and is accessible through large swing doors, for which some people may need assistance.

The screenroom is located on the first floor, which you can get to by going up a staircase (about 20 steps), recogniseable by its beige carpet.

People wishing to use the lift (in the red hall) in order to gain access to the screenroom are kindly requested to ask for assistance at the welcome desk on the ground floor. A member of staff will accompany you.

FINDING A SEAT AT BEURSSCHOUWBURG

Once you are on the right floor, you will enter the screenroom via a ramp. People in wheelchairs may ask staff for assistance to find a place that works for them. Seating is composed mainly of standard chairs with armrests, which could make them uncomfortable for fat folks and people with other special seating needs.

GETTING TO THE TOILET AT BEURSSCHOUWBURG

The toilets are located on the first floor and are accessible via a staircase (around 20 steps), which is recognizable by its beige carpet.

People in wheelchairs or with other mobility issues are recommended to use the toilets in the basement, which can be accessed by using the lift in the red hall, preferably accompanied by a staff member from the welcome desk.

ATTENDING PINK SCREENS AT BEURSSCHOUWBURG AS A DEAF - OR HEARING IMPAIRED PERSON Most films are subtitled in two languages: English and French, French and Dutch, or English and French. Please refer to the programme to find out more about the film you wish to see.

The film presentations and discussions will take place mostly in French, via microphones. No Sign language interpreter will be present.

ATTENDING PINK SCREENS AT BEURSSCHOUWBURG AS A NEUROATYPICAL

Beursschouwburg is equipped with a "quiet room" which can be accessed only via the staircase (20 steps) recognizable by tis beige carpet. It is located on a landing opposite the toilets and can be closed off entirely. The quiet space is equipped with sofas and water.
