

CINEMA GALERIES (1)

ARRIVING BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Bus 29 + 38 + 63 + 66 +71 (Stop at Arenberg - 230 m walk, mostly flat -)
Metro 1, 5 (Stop at Brouckère - 650 m walk, mostly flat - or stop at Gare Centrale -

400m walk downhill -)

Tram 3, 4 (Stop at Brouckère - 650 m walk, mostly flat -)

ENTERING CINEMA GALERIES

Cinéma Galeries is located on the inside of the Galerie de la Reine. To get to it, you may take any entrance to the Royal Galeries Saint Hubert which are either floor-level or are equipped with a ramp.

Once you have arrived in front the the Galeries Cinema, you will find yourself in front of a pair of swing doors, for which fat folks or people in wheelchairs may need assistance.

GETTING TO THE BAR

The bar is located on the ground floor, in the main hall and is therefore accessible to people in wheelchairs. A few seats are available in this area for people who may need to sit down.

FINDING A SEAT IN THE SCREENROOM

the screenroom is accessible via a ramp, and there are spots available for people in wheelchairs (please ask cinéma staff for assistance).

All seats in Galeries have armrests which can not be removed and there are not loveseats (benches) available. The width of the seats at Galeries cinéma is around 50 cm (tested by a person sized 3-4XL who was only just able to settle down in the seats, though it was tight).

GETTING TO THE TOILETS

The Cinéma Galeries toilets are located in the basement, and are only accessible via a staircase (around 15 steps), therefore not accessible for people in wheelchairs. Toilets are not gendered. The toilet stalls open towards the outside, and may be too ight for fat folks as the space between the door and the toilet is limited.

ATTENDING PINK SCREENS AT CINEMA GALERIES AS A DEAF- OR HEARING IMPAIRED PERSON Most films are subtitled in two languages: English and French, French and Dutch, or English and French. Please refer to the programme to find out more about the film you wish to see.

The film presentations and discussions will take place mostly in French, via microphones. No Sign language interpreter will be present.

ATTENDING PINK SCREENS AT GALERIES CINEMA AS A NEUROATYPICAL

Cinéma Galeries does not have a specific designated space to move away from noise and crowds. However, people who can use stairs may go upstairs to the first floor, where there is a little table with a bench. During exhibition opening hours, it is also possible to admire the exhibition in the basement (accessible via a staircase) where the atmosphere can be a bit calmer.
